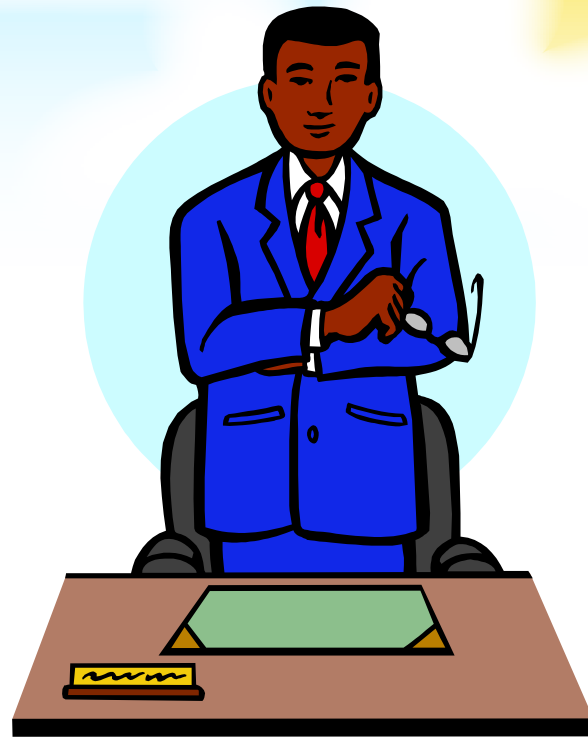

West Nile virus is a disease spread by mosquitoes. The condition ranges from mild to severe. West Nile Virus was first identified in 1937 in Uganda in Eastern Africa. It was then discovered the summer of 1999 in New York and since then has spread all across the United States.

Symptoms:

Abdominal pain, Diarrhea, Fever, Headache, lack of appetite, Muscle Aches, nausea, Rash, Sore throat, Vomiting

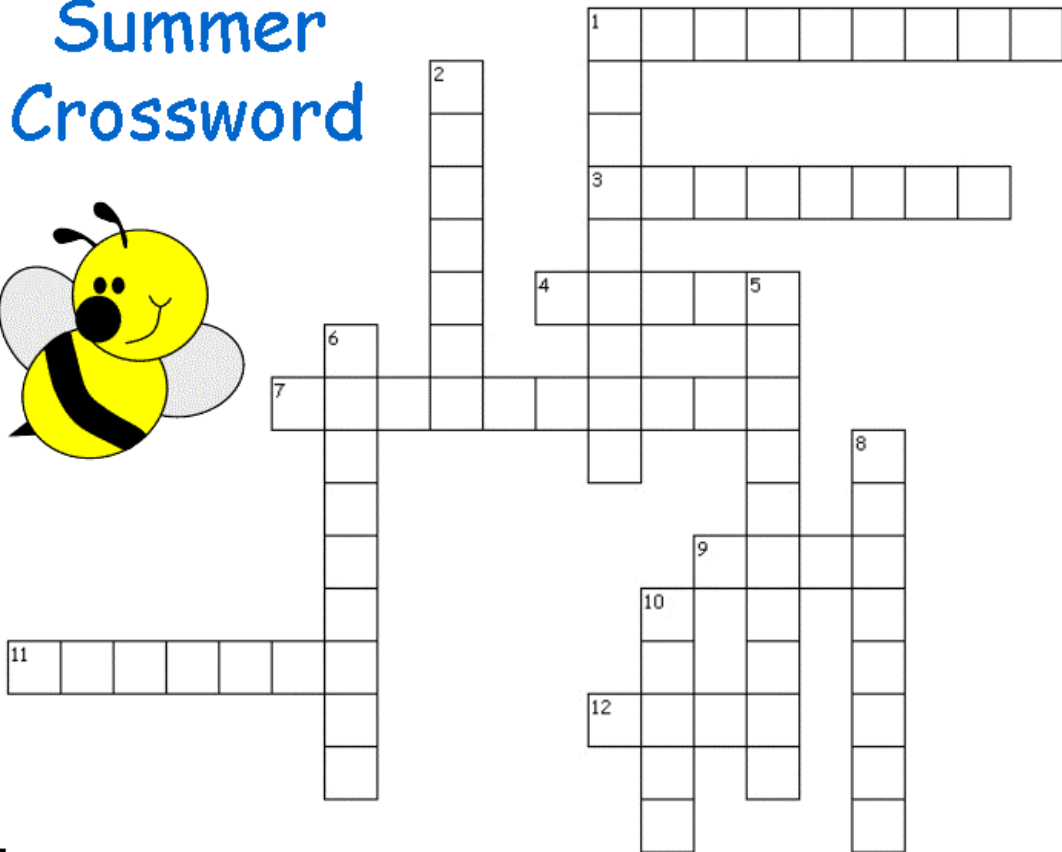
The symptoms usually remain for 3-6 days.
